During one of the longest and fiercest campaigns in US history, Donald Trump has walked around the wildest possible issues, blew the trumpets of hysteria and the walls of decency fell, making the walls of human rights tremble on their basis and also democracy.

As a matter of fact, the Trumpets of wrath have unleashed a virtual tsunami that is destroying the credit of the elites and generating a new wave of nationalism across the west that might lead to no less than a disintegration of Europe.

Steve Bannon (63), whom the president-elect has named senior counselor and chief White House strategist, has revealed Trump's ambition and vision.

Bannon who was playing a central role in Trump's election is predicting a political revolution in the States and a populist revolt in the whole world.

Bannon has dark, populist worldviews: at home, a corrupt ruling class preying on working Americans; globally, "the Judeo-Christian West" waging a war against Islamic fascism.". Like Reagan, Donald Trump addressed the people he called "the forgotten men and women of our country" — the white working and middle class. He vowed to take on Islamic radicalism, as Reagan had faced off against communism.

As a filmmaker, Mr. Bannon has cited both the Nazi propagandist Leni Riefenstahl and the left-wing documentarian Michael Moore as models. Senator Bernie Sanders of Vermont, who challenged Hillary Clinton for the Democratic presidential nomination, has variously called Mr. Bannon a racist, a sexist, an anti-Semite and an islamophobic freak.

Rarely has there been so incendiary a figure at the side of a president-elect, thrilling Mr. Trump's more extreme supporters while unnerving ethnic and religious minorities.

He has sometimes portrayed a grave threat to civilization not just from violent jihadists but from "Islam." He once suggested to a colleague that perhaps only property owners should be allowed to vote. Trump about Bannon: "He is the least politically correct person I know. His overriding concern is getting the mission accomplished."





By the time of a Tea Party gathering in 2010 in New York, Steve Bannon had fully embraced a class-based diagnosis of the country's woes: "In the last 20 years, our financial elites and the political class have taken care of themselves and led our country to the brink of ruin," he said. "America has lost its way and it's lost its strength, and Americans are looking for leadership," he said.

What basically made Trump's success is that he was telling the voters a story that is completely different from that of the liberal elites.

Since the cognitive revolution, around 20.000 years ago, people have loved to believe in stories that are offering them meaning and direction. Buddha, Abraham, Moses, Jesus, Mohammed, Luther, Napoleon, Lenin, Hitler, Churchill, de Gaulle, or even the late Castro have, according to Harari, told Homo Sapiens simple stories that seem to make sense, to offer them a general direction and to guarantee hope.

It has become commonplace to suggest that the European construction is one of those beautiful stories. However decision makers in Brussels fail to make the European dream come true. It is unlikely to become any better with President Trump on the world scene.

From the onset, America has been viewed by all as an irreplaceable strategic ally. This may no longer be the case with Trump. The opposite may even prove obvious. Donald is indeed standing for « *America first* » — which basically implies a radical US move towards isolationism, directly leading towards cultural fragmentation and narrow parochialism out of fear towards globalization.

Trump, the anti-globalism President elect is clearly very negative towards NATO and the European Union: he proved very positive towards the Brexit, giving his full support to Nigel Farage leading character of the Europe sceptics and anti-immigration parties. He described his own electoral victory as *a plus plus Brexit*.

Trump is widely seen as both a threat and a challenge by the Brussels *Eurocrats* and as a windfall by populist and Europhobe party leaders (Marine Le Pen, Geert Wilders Victor Orban...) who have had the wind in their sails since he won the election (France's Front National, Germany's A.F.D., the Dutch P.V.V.,...)

Obviously Trump wishes to develop contacts with individual states prior to negotiations with a supranational institution that, in his eyes, is doomed to collapse.

If he were to favor contacts with populist, Europhobe and sovereigntist partners such as Orban, prime minister of Hungary and the like, he might definitely cause unbearable intra-European tensions.

On the other hand, this could be a golden opportunity for Europe to pull itself together and take its destiny in its own hands and cut the umbilical cord with Uncle Sam and eventually write a completely new European script.
